Analysis

SB 21 moves the registration and licensing of Mobile Intensive Care Paramedics (MICP) from the State Medical Board, Division of Corporations, Business, and Professional Licensing (CBPL), to the Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS), Division of Emergency Services. This legislation provides a career path for Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT) to become Mobile Intensive Care Paramedics (MICPs), as EMTs are currently licensed by DHSS.

Changes to regulations to reflect this change will be combined with planned regulations packages. CBPL does not anticipate additional fiscal impact from this legislation.

Professional licensing programs within the Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing are funded by Receipt Supported Services, fund source 1156 Rcpt Svcs (DGF). Licensing fees for each occupation are set per AS 08.01.065 the total amount of revenue collected approximately equals the occupation's actual regulatory costs.

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
