A BILL**FOR AN ACT ENTITLED**

1 "An Act relating to waiver of tuition and fees for certain family members of
2 a member of the armed services, a peace officer, or a fire fighter killed in the
3 line of duty; and providing for an effective date."

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

5 * Section 1. AS 14.43.085 is amended to read:

6 **Sec. 14.43.085. Free tuition and fees for a spouse or dependent of a peace**

7 **officer or members of the armed services or a fire department. (a)** A person
8 enrolled as a student in good standing in a state supported educational institution in
9 this state is entitled to a waiver of **undergraduate** tuition and fees if the person was
10 the spouse or dependent child of a bona fide resident of the state who was

11 **(1)** a member of the armed services and who died in the line of duty
12 or who died as a result of injuries sustained while in the line of duty for the state or
13 federal government or **who** was listed by the United States Department of Defense as
14 a prisoner of war or as missing in action; **or**

(2) a peace officer or a member of a fire department who died from an act arising out of and in the course of

(A) employment as a peace officer or a fire fighter; or

(B) duties as a volunteer fire fighter.

(b) In this section,

(1) "armed services" means the Alaska National Guard, Alaska Naval Militia, and the armed services of the United States;

(2) "dependent child" means a person who was a dependent of a peace officer or of a member of the armed services or a fire department at the time of the peace officer's or member's death, and who is

(A) the **peace officer's** or member's natural or adopted child;

(B) a child in relation to whom the deceased armed services **fighter, or peace officer** stood in loco parentis for at least three years before the **peace officer's or member's death**:

(C) the **peace officer's or** member's stepchild; or

(D) the peace officer's or member's acknowledged illegitimate

(3) "fire department" means a federal, state, or municipal fire department or a regularly organized volunteer fire department registered with the state fire marshal;

(4) "line of duty" has the meaning given under federal law;

(5) "peace officer" has the meaning given in AS 01.10.060 and includes a correctional officer;

(6) [(4)] "resident" means a person who resided in the state for at least one year before serving in the armed services and who lists Alaska as the home state for purposes of military records, or a person who was employed as a peace officer in this state or was a member of a fire department located in this state;

(7) "spouse" means a person who was married to a peace officer or to a member of the armed services or a fire department at the time of the peace officer's or member's death.

31 * **Sec. 2. APPLICABILITY.** (a) A person who is enrolled as a student and who is

1 described in sec. 1 of this Act is entitled to a waiver of tuition and fees regardless of whether
2 the person who died in the line of duty or who died from an act arising out of and in the
3 course of employment or duties as a volunteer fire fighter died before, on, or after the
4 effective date of this Act. A person who is entitled to a waiver of tuition and fees as
5 described in sec. 1 of this Act and who has already paid tuition or fees before the effective
6 date of this Act is not entitled to a refund.

7 (b) This Act does not apply to a person enrolled as a graduate student in a state
8 supported educational institution on the effective date of this Act.

9 * **Sec. 3.** This Act takes effect July 1, 1998.
