- 1 "An Act relating to false statements and omissions in regard to application for
- 2 fish and game licenses, tags, and permits and to nonresident hunters."
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
- * Section 1. AS 16.05.420(b) is repealed and reenacted to read:
- (b) A person may not make a false statement, or omit a material fact, in an application for a license, tag, or permit issued under AS 16.05.330 16.05.430. A person who without any culpable mental state makes a false statement as to the person's identity or residency in an application for a license, tag, or permit issued under AS 16.05.330 16.05.430 is guilty of a violation and upon conviction is punishable by a fine of not more than \$300. A person who knowingly violates this subsection is guilty of a class A misdemeanor.
- * Sec. 2. AS 16.05.430(a) is amended to read:
- 13 (a) Except as provided in <u>AS 16.05.407(b) and (d), 16.05.408(b), and</u>
 14 16.05.420(b) [AS 16.05.420(b)], a person who violates AS 16.05.330 16.05.420 or

- a regulation adopted under AS 16.05.330 16.05.420 is guilty of a misdemeanor and
- 2 upon conviction is punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000, or by imprisonment
- 3 for not more than six months, or by both.
