A RESOLUTION

Commemorating the attack on Pearl Harbor by establishing Pearl Harbor
 Remembrance Day.

3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS on December 7, 1941, the Imperial Japanese Navy and Air Force attacked
units of the armed forces of the United States stationed at Pearl Harbor in Hawaii; and

6 WHEREAS more than 2,000 citizens of the United States were killed and more than
7 1,000 citizens of the United States were wounded in the attack on Pearl Harbor; and

8 WHEREAS the attack on Pearl Harbor marked the entry of the United States into9 World War II; and

10 WHEREAS the veterans of World War II and other people of the United States
11 regard December 7 of each year as the day to remember the attack on Pearl Harbor; and

WHEREAS commemoration of the attack on Pearl Harbor will foster appreciation of
the selfless sacrifice of the individuals who served in the armed forces of the United States
during World War II;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature declares December 7, 1995, to
be Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day, and encourages the Governor to issue a proclamation

calling on the people of the state to observe the day with appropriate ceremonies and
activities, including flying the flag of the state at half-mast in honor of the individuals who
died as a result of their service at Pearl Harbor.
