A RESOLUTION

- 1 Relating to proposed Federal Aviation Administration regulations establishing crew
- 2 member flight time limitations.
- 3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
- 4 WHEREAS the Federal Aviation Administration is proposing to adopt regulations
- 5 establishing limitations on crew member flight time that will have a negative effect on aviation
- 6 safety and Alaska businesses; and
- 7 WHEREAS air taxi operations provide a valuable and necessary service to Alaskans,
- 8 often being the sole means of delivering goods and services to rural communities; and
- 9 WHEREAS Alaska is unique in its geography, weather conditions, short summers, and
- 10 long daylight hours and thus regulations and standards designed for the "Lower 48" states
- 11 must be applied flexibly in Alaska; and
- WHEREAS the Alaska tourism industry creates seasonal employment opportunities
- 13 that have allowed air taxi operators the opportunity to train experienced, dedicated, and
- 14 professional pilots; and
- WHEREAS, under current regulations, air taxi operators have established businesses
- 16 that allow professional crew members to earn a viable income in a safe manner; and

1	WHEREAS Alaska's air taxi operators have provided a safe environment for their
2	crew members and the public; and
3	WHEREAS the proposed regulations will reduce the availability of experienced pilots
4	on air taxi flights within Alaska and compel air service operations to utilize less experienced
5	pilots which would affect aircraft maintenance rates, insurance rates, air fares, and accident
6	rates; and
7	WHEREAS it is not in the public interest to disrupt the necessary and valuable service
8	provided by air service operations in Alaska through the implementation of overly restrictive
9	regulation; and
10	WHEREAS the National Air Transportation Association and the Alaska Air Carriers
11	Association oppose the proposed regulations;
12	BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests the Federal
13	Aviation Administration to exempt Alaska from the application of the proposed regulations
14	establishing crew member flight time limitations (14 C.F.R. Part 135.269 and 135.271).
15	COPIES of this resolution shall be sent to the Honorable Bill Clinton, President of the
16	United States; the Honorable Federico F. Pena, Secretary of the U.S. Department of
17	Transportation; the Honorable David R. Hinson, Administrator, U.S. Department of
18	Transportation, Federal Aviation Administration; and to the Honorable Ted Stevens and the
19	Honorable Frank Murkowski, U.S. Senators, and the Honorable Don Young, U.S.
20	Representative, members of the Alaska delegation in Congress.
