A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

1 "An Act relating to the University of Alaska and to assets of the University
2 of Alaska; authorizing the University of Alaska to select additional state public
3 domain land, designating that land as 'university trust land,' and describing the
4 principles applicable to the land's management and the development of its
5 resources; and defining the net income from the University of Alaska's
6 endowment trust fund as 'university receipts' subject to prior legislative
7 appropriation."

8 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

9 * **Section 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.** The legislature finds that
10 (1) as the beneficiary under the provisions of the Acts of August 30, 1890, and
11 March 4, 1907, designating the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines as
12 beneficiary, and of March 4, 1915, 38 Stat. 1214, transferring certain land for its location and
13 support, the University of Alaska is a land grant university;

1 (2) under the Acts of March 4, 1915, 38 Stat. 1214, and January 21, 1929, 45
2 Stat. 1091, the Congress of the United States granted to the Territory of Alaska certain federal
3 land to be held in trust for the benefit of the predecessor of the University of Alaska;

4 (3) the Territory was unable to receive most of the land conveyed by the Act
5 of March 4, 1915, before repeal of that Act by Sec. 6(k) of the Alaska Statehood Act (P.L.
6 85-508, 72 Stat. 339);

7 (4) the Congress of the United States granted the State of Alaska the right to
8 select 102,500,000 acres of federal land under Sec. 6(b) of the Alaska Statehood Act;

9 (5) the land selection rights embodied in the Alaska Statehood Act reflect in
10 part congressional recognition that the state would need the land to support its government and
11 programs, and the Congress assumed that the State of Alaska would in turn devote some of
12 the land or the income from it for the use and benefit of the University of Alaska;

13 (6) most land grant colleges in the western United States have obtained a larger
14 land grant from the federal government than the University of Alaska has received;

15 (7) an academically strong and financially secure state university system is a
16 cornerstone to the long-term development of a stable population and to a healthy, diverse
17 economy in the state;

18 (8) it is in the best interests of the state and the University of Alaska that the
19 university take ownership of a significant and substantial portfolio of income producing land
20 in order to provide income for the support of public higher education in the state; and

21 (9) renewable resources should be managed on a sustained yield basis, taking
22 into account the total land grant.

23 * **Sec. 2.** LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the legislature that the University
24 of Alaska encourage the development of in-state value-added industries to the maximum extent
25 feasible when developing land conveyed under AS 14.40.365.

26 * **Sec. 3.** AS 14.40.170(a) is amended to read:

27 (a) The Board of Regents shall

28 (1) appoint the president of the university by a majority vote of the
29 whole board, and the president may attend meetings of the board;

30 (2) fix the compensation of the president of the university, all heads of
31 departments, professors, teachers, instructors, and other officers;

1 (3) confer such appropriate degrees as it may determine and prescribe;
2 (4) have the care, control, and management of
3 (A) all the real and personal property of the university; and
4 (B) land
5 (i) conveyed to the Board of Regents by the
6 commissioner of natural resources in the settlement of the claim of the
7 University of Alaska to land granted to the state in accordance with the
8 Act of March 4, 1915 (38 Stat. 1214), as amended, and in accordance
9 with the Act of January 21, 1929 (45 Stat. 1091), as amended; **and**
10 (ii) conveyed to the Board of Regents by the
11 commissioner of natural resources under AS 14.40.365, except as
12 provided in AS 14.40.368(a)(2);
13 (5) keep a correct and easily understood record of the minutes of every
14 meeting and all acts done by it in pursuance of its duties;
15 (6) under procedures to be established by the commissioner of
16 administration, and in accordance with existing procedures for other state agencies,
17 have the care, control, and management of all money of the university and keep a
18 complete record of all money received and disbursed;
19 (7) adopt reasonable rules for the prudent trust management and the
20 long-term financial benefit to the university of the land of the university;
21 (8) provide public notice of sales, leases, exchanges, and transfers of
22 the land of the university or of interests in land of the university;
23 (9) report each year within the first 10 days of the convening of a
24 regular session of the legislature on the expenditures made during the preceding fiscal
25 year from the funds of the University of Alaska that are derived from sales, leases,
26 exchanges, or transfers of the land of the university or of interests in land of the
27 university
28 (A) that were conveyed to the University of Alaska in
29 settlement of the claim of the University of Alaska to land granted to the state
30 in accordance with the Act of March 4, 1915 (38 Stat. 1214), as amended, and
31 in accordance with the Act of January 21, 1929 (45 Stat. 1091), as amended;

1 and
2 (B) that were conveyed to the University of Alaska under
3 AS 14.40.365.

4 * **Sec. 4.** AS 14.40.190 is amended to read:

5 Sec. 14.40.190. REPORT. (a) The Board of Regents shall prepare a written
6 report at the beginning of each first regular session of the legislature of

7 (1) the condition of [THE] university property;

8 (2) [, OF] all receipts and expenditures, including the administration
9 and disposition of appropriated and restricted funds;

10 (3) the management of university trust land under
11 AS 14.40.366(a)(1) and (2); and

12 (4) [, AND OF] the educational and other work performed during the
13 preceding two fiscal years.

14 (b) The board shall notify the legislature that the report is available.

15 * **Sec. 5.** AS 14.40.280 is amended to read:

16 Sec. 14.40.280. ENDOWMENTS AND DONATIONS. All monetary gifts,
17 bequests, or endowments that are made to the University of Alaska for the purpose of
18 the separate trust fund created under AS 14.40.400 shall be held by the university.

19 The university [TRANSFERRED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE. THE
20 DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE] shall manage that money in accordance with
21 AS 14.40.400. Title to and control or possession of land, personal property, and all
22 money [OTHER THAN] that [TRANSFERRED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
23 REVENUE, WHICH] is devised, bequeathed, or given to the university for the
24 purpose of the endowment trust fund established by AS 14.40.400(a) shall be taken
25 by the university in its corporate capacity acting by and through the regents or an
26 authorized agent, and shall be entered in the perpetual inventory of the university.

27 * **Sec. 6.** AS 14.40.291 is amended to read:

28 Sec. 14.40.291. LAND OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ALASKA [NOT PUBLIC
29 DOMAIN] LAND SALE CONTRACTS; CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. (a)
30 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, university-grant land, state replacement
31 land that becomes university-grant land on conveyance to the university, land

1 conveyed to the University of Alaska under AS 14.40.365, and any other land owned
2 by the University of Alaska is not and may not be treated as state public domain land.

3 (b) Land conveyed to the University of Alaska under AS 14.40.365 is
4 designated as university trust land.

5 (c) Title to or interest in [TO] land described in (a) of this section may not
6 be acquired by adverse possession, prescription, or in any other manner except by
7 conveyance from the university.

8 (d) The land described in (a) of this section is subject to condemnation for
9 public purpose in accordance with law.

10 * Sec. 7. AS 14.40.291 is amended by adding new subsections to read:

11 (e) If a contract for a sale of land of the university is breached, the president
12 of the university or the president's designee, in addition to other remedies available
13 under the law, may issue a decision to foreclose and terminate the contract at any time
14 31 days after delivering by certified mail a written notice of the breach to the address
15 of record of the purchaser. The purchaser may cure a breach caused by the failure to
16 make payments required by the contract within 30 days after the notice of the breach
17 has been received by the purchaser by payment of the sum in default together with the
18 larger of a fee of \$50 or five percent of the sum in default. If there are material facts
19 in dispute between the university and the purchaser, the purchaser may submit a
20 written request to the president or the president's designee for the review of the facts
21 within 30 days after the notice of the breach has been received.

22 (f) On a determination that there has been a breach of the contract based on
23 the administrative record, the president of the university or the president's designee
24 shall issue a decision foreclosing the interest of the purchaser and terminating the
25 contract. The obligation to make payments under the contract continues through the
26 date of the decision to foreclose.

27 (g) The president of the university or the president's designee shall deliver the
28 decision to foreclose and terminate, either by personal delivery to the purchaser or by
29 certified mail, return receipt requested, to the address of record of the purchaser. If
30 the breach is a failure to make payments required by the contract, the decision must
31 include a notice to the purchaser that, if within 30 days the purchaser pays to the

1 university the full amount of the unpaid contract price, including all accrued interest
2 and any fees assessed under (e) of this section, the university shall issue to the
3 purchaser a deed to the land. If full payment is not made within 30 days or the breach
4 is for other than failure to make payment, the decision forecloses and terminates all
5 legal and equitable rights the purchaser has in the land.

6 (h) Notwithstanding AS 09.25.100 - 09.25.220, on a determination that it is
7 in the best interest of the university or on the request of the person who has provided
8 the information, the president may keep the following confidential:

9 (1) the names of a person applying for the sale, lease, or other disposal
10 of university land or an interest in university land;

11 (2) before the announced time of opening of an offer to purchase, lease,
12 or obtain a disposal of university land, the names of the participants and the terms of
13 their offers;

14 (3) all geological, geophysical, engineering, architectural, sales,
15 appraisal, gross receipts, net receipts, or other financial information relating to
16 university land or an interest in university land considered for or offered for disposal
17 or currently subject to a contract;

18 (4) cost data and financial information submitted by an applicant in
19 support of applications for bonds, leases, or other information in offerings and ongoing
20 operations relating to management of university land;

21 (5) applications for rights-of-way or easements across university land;
22 and

23 (6) requests for information about or applications by public agencies
24 for university land that is being considered for use for a public purpose.

25 * **Sec. 8.** AS 14.40 is amended by adding a new section to read:

26 Sec. 14.40.365. SELECTION AND CONVEYANCE OF STATE LAND TO
27 THE UNIVERSITY OF ALASKA. (a) For the purposes of providing support to the
28 state's public higher education system and for the purpose of generating responsible
29 and appropriate development of the state's land and resources, the University of Alaska
30 is authorized to receive the conveyance of 350,000 acres of land that, on the effective
31 date of this section, is owned by the state, or has been tentatively approved or selected

1 by the state under the Alaska Statehood Act and that has not been reserved by law
2 from the state public domain land and designated as part of a state park, state forest,
3 state game refuge, state wildlife refuge, state game sanctuary, state recreational area,
4 state recreational river, state wilderness park, state marine park, state special
5 management area, state public use area, critical habitat area, bald eagle preserve, bison
6 range, or moose range.

7 (b) For purposes of making the selection and conveyance of state land to the
8 university under (a) of this section, the director of the division of land, Department of
9 Natural Resources, and the director of the University of Alaska's land management
10 office shall compile and maintain and may revise a list of the land to be conveyed to
11 the university under this section. The list shall be maintained at the Anchorage office
12 of the director of the division of land. The list may not include the valid existing
13 selections of a municipality to which the municipality is entitled under AS 29.65.010 -
14 29.65.140, may not include the valid existing selections of the Alaska Mental Health
15 Trust Authority made for the purpose of reconstituting the mental health trust
16 established under the Alaska Mental Health Enabling Act, P.L. 84-830, 70 Stat. 709
17 (1956) that become subject to management under AS 38.05.801, and may not include
18 land whose management by the University of Alaska would be inconsistent with the
19 provisions of law providing for reconstitution of that mental health trust. If there is
20 a disagreement between the university and the Department of Natural Resources about
21 the land to be placed on the list, the disagreement must be submitted to the governor,
22 who shall make the final decision. The governor, upon the recommendation of the
23 director of the division of land and the director of the university's land management
24 office, shall periodically submit to the legislature, within 30 days of the beginning of
25 a regular legislative session, a list of land proposed to be conveyed by the state to the
26 University of Alaska under this section. Each list must contain not less than 25,000
27 acres of land, or the remaining entitlement under (a) of this section, whichever is less.
28 A list may identify land in excess of the amount of acreage set out in (a) of this
29 section, but the amount of land identified on the list may not exceed by more than 25
30 percent in total acreage the amount of acreage to which, on the date of submission of
31 the list to the legislature, the university has not received title under this section. If, on

1 a list presented to the legislature under this section, the amount of land to be conveyed
2 exceeds the balance due the university under this section, the university shall set out
3 the land to be conveyed in priority order, and thereafter, when the university receives
4 conveyance of title to land, the commissioner shall reduce the excess acreage by
5 striking from the list the land that has the lowest priority, and shall continue to strike
6 acreage from the list until the list of land to be conveyed does not exceed by more
7 than 25 percent in total acreage the amount of acreage to which the university has not
8 received title under this section. The legislature must approve or disapprove a list of
9 land to be conveyed by the end of the regular legislative session following the
10 submission of the list. The legislature may approve some, or all, of the land proposed
11 for conveyance.

12 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, on land approved by the
13 legislature for conveyance under (b) of this section but not yet conveyed by quitclaim
14 deed to the University of Alaska or for which a document of interim conveyance has
15 not been issued to the University of Alaska under this section,

16 (1) the state is authorized to enter into contracts and grant leases,
17 licenses, claims, prospecting sites, sales, permits, rights-of-way, or easements, and any
18 interim conveyance or quitclaim deed shall be subject to the contract, lease, license,
19 claim, prospecting site, sale, permit, right-of-way, or easement, except that the
20 authority granted the state by this subsection

21 (A) is the authority that the state otherwise would have had
22 under existing laws and regulations had the land not been approved by the
23 legislature for conveyance under (b) of this section; and

24 (B) may be exercised only if the University of Alaska has
25 concurred before the action is taken by the state;

26 (2) after approval of a list by the legislature under (b) of this section,
27 and until the land has been conveyed by quitclaim deed or by a document of interim
28 conveyance, 90 percent of the proceeds derived from contracts, leases, licenses, claims,
29 prospecting sites, sales, permits, rights-of-way, or easements, or from trespasses,
30 originating after the date of submission of the list to the legislature under (b) of this
31 section shall be held by the state; upon the issuance of a document of interim

1 conveyance or a quitclaim deed, the state shall pay to the University of Alaska the
2 proceeds held by the state under this paragraph, and subsequent to the issuance of a
3 document of interim conveyance or a quitclaim deed, the University of Alaska shall
4 receive all of the proceeds derived from the contracts, leases, licenses, claims,
5 prospecting sites, sales, permits, rights-of-way, or easements, or from trespasses;

6 (3) responsibility for management of contracts, leases, licenses, claims,
7 prospecting sites, sales, permits, rights-of-way, or easements, vests with the University
8 of Alaska upon issuance of a quitclaim deed or a document of interim conveyance.

9 (d) When land is conveyed to the University of Alaska under this section, it
10 shall be conveyed in fee simple. The state may convey to the university any tideland
11 or submerged land adjacent to the land conveyed under this section. The University
12 of Alaska takes the land subject to any possessory interest held by another person on
13 the effective date of the conveyance and subject to the terms and conditions of
14 conveyance and the provisions of AS 14.40.365 - 14.40.400. Except as provided in
15 AS 14.40.368(a)(1), the University of Alaska is entitled to receive the consideration
16 due under that possessory interest for the duration of the possessory interest.

17 (e) In conveying land to the University of Alaska under this section, the
18 commissioner of natural resources shall give public notice under AS 38.05.945(b) and
19 (c) and provide for access under AS 38.05.127, but other provisions of AS 38.04 and
20 AS 38.05 do not apply.

21 (f) Land transferred or conveyed to the University of Alaska under this section
22 (1) is subject to

23 (A) Sec. 6(i) of the Alaska Statehood Act (P.L. 85-508, 72 Stat.
24 339);

25 (B) art. IX of the state constitution;

26 (C) AS 19.10.010;

27 (D) payment to the Alaska permanent fund of the amounts
28 required by AS 37.13.010(a) and (b); and

29 (E) the rights of the state under former 43 U.S.C. 932 (sec. 8,
30 Act of July 26, 1866, 14 Stat. 253);

31 (2) excludes any interest transferred to the state by quitclaim deed dated

June 30, 1959, under authority of the Alaska Omnibus Act, P.L. 86-70, 73 Stat. 141.

(g) The University of Alaska shall bear all costs of selection, platting, surveying, and, except for a cost specified in (i) of this section, conveyance of the land that it selects under this section and, subject to appropriation, shall reimburse the Department of Natural Resources for the reasonable costs incurred by that department relating to that selection, platting, surveying, and conveyance. Under this subsection,

(1) if the land has been surveyed,

(A) the boundaries of the land conveyed must conform to the public land subdivisions established by the approved survey; and

(B) the commissioner shall issue a quitclaim deed to the land within one year of receiving a request for the land's conveyance from the university;

(2) if the land is unsurveyed, the commissioner shall

(A) survey the exterior boundaries of the land to be conveyed without interior subdivision; and

(B) issue a quitclaim deed to the land in terms of the exterior boundary survey within one year of receiving a request for the land's conveyance by the university.

(h) For land due the University of Alaska under this section that is unsurveyed, pending the survey of exterior boundaries and issuance of a quitclaim deed, the commissioner of natural resources shall, within one year of request by the university, prepare and provide to the University of Alaska a document of interim conveyance for the land to be conveyed.

(i) Except as provided in AS 14.40.368(a)(2), management of land conveyed to the University of Alaska by a quitclaim deed or by a document of interim conveyance vests with the University of Alaska from the date of recording of the quitclaim deed or document of interim conveyance. The state shall pay the cost of recording all quitclaim deeds and documents of interim conveyance.

(j) The University of Alaska may not make a land selection under this section after December 31, 2003.

* **Sec. 9.** AS 14.40 is amended by adding new sections to read:

1 Sec. 14.40.366. MANAGEMENT AND DISPOSITION OF UNIVERSITY
2 TRUST LAND. (a) University trust land conveyed under AS 14.40.365 shall be
3 conveyed to the Board of Regents and held by the Board of Regents in trust for the
4 University of Alaska. Tideland and submerged land that is conveyed to the University
5 of Alaska under AS 14.40.365(d) may not, after its conveyance, be sold. The
6 University of Alaska

7 (1) shall manage university trust land in accordance with applicable
8 trust management principles subject to the terms and conditions of conveyance and the
9 provisions of AS 14.40.365 - 14.40.400;

10 (2) shall manage university trust land under provisions of law
11 applicable to other university land; and

12 (3) may exchange other state land for university trust land under the
13 procedures set out in AS 38.50.

14 (b) The University of Alaska shall establish

15 (1) policies to provide for public notice and comment on proposals for
16 development, exchange, or sale of university trust land conveyed under AS 14.40.365;

17 (2) procedures for mineral entry or location and mineral leasing, and
18 shall adopt rent and royalty schedules, on university trust land conveyed under
19 AS 14.40.365 that are substantially similar to mineral entry, location, and leasing
20 procedures, and rent and royalty schedules, for state land under AS 38.05.185 -
21 38.05.275.

22 (c) The Board of Regents shall adopt policies that provide that the university
23 shall every second year prepare a plan for management and disposition of university
24 trust land conveyed under AS 14.40.365 and shall, not less than 60 days before
25 scheduled approval by the Board of Regents of the plan,

26 (1) make copies of the plan available at all legislative information
27 offices and at such other locations as the university may designate;

28 (2) publish a notice in newspapers of general circulation in the state
29 that provides the public with information on the locations where the plan is available
30 for public inspection;

31 (3) give notice to all legislators and to local governments with

1 jurisdiction over the land affected by the plan; and

2 (4) seek public comment on the plan prior to action by the Board of
3 Regents approving the plan.

4 (d) The policy set out in AS 44.99.100(b)(5) applies to management of the
5 resources of university trust land conveyed under AS 14.40.365. In carrying out this
6 policy, the Board of Regents shall ensure that the provisions of AS 44.99.100(b)(5)
7 apply to the development of the resources of university trust land.

8 (e) To the extent consistent with law, in contracts for the harvest or removal
9 of timber from university trust land conveyed under AS 14.40.365, the Board of
10 Regents shall require the primary manufacture of the timber before the timber is
11 exported from the state.

12 Sec. 14.40.368. MANAGEMENT AND DISPOSITION OF INCOME FROM
13 EXISTING ENCUMBRANCES ON UNIVERSITY TRUST LAND. (a) For the land
14 conveyed to the University of Alaska under AS 14.40.365 that is, as of the effective
15 date of the conveyance, subject to a lease, license, contract, claim, prospecting site,
16 sale, permit, or right-of-way

17 (1) the state is entitled to receive 50 percent of the income obtained
18 from the lease, license, contract, claim, prospecting site, sale, permit, or right-of-way
19 for the duration of the term of the lease, contract, claim, prospecting site, sale, permit,
20 or right-of-way, and during any renewal of it that is authorized by the lease, license,
21 contract, claim, prospecting site, sale, permit, or right-of-way, or by law;

22 (2) the responsibility for the management of the land vests with the
23 University of Alaska only upon conclusion of the term, including any renewals, of the
24 lease, license, contract, claim, prospecting site, sale, permit, or right-of-way that is
25 authorized by law.

26 (b) If the state and the university mutually agree that the responsibility for the
27 management of land may be transferred to the university at a date earlier than the date
28 described in (a)(2) of this section, then, notwithstanding (a)(1) of this section, the
29 university is entitled to receive all income described in (a)(1) of this section on or after
30 the effective date of the transfer of the management responsibility.

31 Sec. 14.40.369. CUSTOMARY AND TRADITIONAL USES TO BE

1 CONTINUED. (a) For land conveyed to the University of Alaska under
2 AS 14.40.365, the University of Alaska shall, before conveying or disposing of an
3 interest in the land to a third party, manage the land in a manner that permits
4 customary and traditional uses of the resources, including hunting, fishing, and
5 recreational opportunities, of that land to the maximum extent possible.

6 (b) The provisions of (a) of this section do not apply to authorize the
7 commercial harvest of timber from the land conveyed to the university.

8 * **Sec. 10.** AS 14.40 is amended by adding a new section to read:

9 Sec. 14.40.375. TORT IMMUNITY FOR PERSONAL INJURIES, DEATH,
10 OR PROPERTY DAMAGE OCCURRING ON UNIVERSITY LAND. (a)
11 Notwithstanding AS 09.65.200 and except as provided in (b) of this section, the
12 University of Alaska is not liable in tort, except for an affirmative act that constitutes
13 gross negligence or reckless or intentional misconduct, for damages for the injury to
14 or death of a person, or for property damage to the property of a person, who enters
15 onto or remains on land owned by the University of Alaska.

16 (b) The provisions of (a) of this section do not apply to damages for injury to
17 or death of a person, or for property damage to the property of a person, that occurs
18 on land of the University of Alaska that, after receipt of title to the land by the
19 University of Alaska, has been improved and is actively maintained by the University
20 of Alaska.

- 10 (3) recovery of indirect costs of university activities;
- 11 (4) **the net income of the trust fund established in AS 14.40.400 and**
12 receipts from sales and rentals of university property;
- 13 (5) federal receipts;
- 14 (6) gifts, grants, and contracts; and
