## FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

1 "An Act relating to the Alaska Day of Prayer."

# 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- \* Section 1. FINDINGS. The legislature finds that
- 4 (1) the National Day of Prayer is a tradition first proclaimed by President
- 5 George Washington in 1775 during the First Continental Congress;
- **6** (2) legislation setting aside the first Thursday in May each year as a National
- 7 Day of Prayer was unanimously passed by the United States Congress in 1988 and signed by
- 8 the President; and
- 9 (3) it is appropriate for the state also to observe an official day of prayer on
- 10 the first Thursday in May each year.
- \* Sec. 2. AS 44.12 is amended by adding a new section to read:
- 12 Sec. 44.12.072. Alaska Day of Prayer. The Alaska Day of Prayer is
- established on the first Thursday in May each year as an opportunity for residents of
- all faiths to join in united prayer to give thanks for blessings received, to request
- healing for wounds endured, to ask divine guidance for our leaders, and to bring

1 wholeness to the citizens of our state and our nation.
