### A RESOLUTION

1 Relating to promotion of Kids Voting Alaska programs.

## 2 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- 3 WHEREAS teaching youth the fundamental democratic principles of voting has
- 4 proven to be successful in promoting responsible citizenship; and
- 5 WHEREAS Kids Voting Alaska programs have been effective in teaching students the
- 6 fundamental principles associated with the exercise of important rights of citizenship and in
- 7 promoting lifelong good voting practices; and
- **8 WHEREAS** Kids Voting programs encourage discussions in homes about the political
- 9 process and current issues; and
- WHEREAS Kids Voting Alaska programs are operated by hundreds of volunteers as
- 11 nonpartisan, nonprofit volunteer programs funded by business contributions and in-kind
- 12 services; and
- WHEREAS Kids Voting programs have been implemented in Alaska and 39 other
- 14 states: and
- WHEREAS Kids Voting Alaska programs provided the first municipal election voting
- 16 experience for youth in the nation, and Alaska is the home of the only community in the
- 17 nation to conduct a Kids Voting program every year since 1992; and

- WHEREAS Kids Voting Alaska programs for K-12 school curricula teach Alaska
  students to be responsible citizens by increasing their understanding of democracy and the
- 3 importance of voting; and
- 4 WHEREAS Kids Voting Alaska programs will be part of the curriculum in at least
- 5 35 Alaska school districts during the 1998 1999 school year; and
- **6** WHEREAS nearly 120,000 students, or 90 percent of all students in Alaska, will have
- 7 the opportunity to participate in Kids Voting Alaska programs by casting their votes on
- **8** November 3, 1998; and
- 9 WHEREAS Kids Voting Alaska has been endorsed and is supported by the Alaska
- 10 Municipal Clerks Association, the Alaska League of Women Voters, the Association of Alaska
- 11 School Boards, the Alaska Council of School Administrators, and NEA-Alaska; and
- WHEREAS the Alaska Congressional delegation, the Governor, and the Lieutenant
- 13 Governor endorse this program by serving on the Honorary Board of Kids Voting Alaska;
- 14 BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature encourages all citizens of Alaska
- 15 to develop Kids Voting programs in their communities; and be it
- 16 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature encourages volunteers,
- 17 teachers, parents, and youth throughout Alaska to participate in every election held in their
- 18 communities; and be it
- 19 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature urges all citizens of Alaska
- 20 to join in support of the continued success of Kids Voting Alaska programs and requests their
- 21 assistance in encouraging volunteers, youth, businesses, organizations, school district
- 22 administrators, teachers, and parents to become actively involved in Kids Voting Alaska
- 23 programs to sustain our democracy through development of an involved and informed
- **24** electorate.
