A RESOLUTION

- 1 Relating to reauthorization of the federal Intermodal Surface Transportation
- 2 Efficiency Act of 1991.
- 3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
- 4 WHEREAS the federal Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991
- 5 (ISTEA) substantially revamped the federal-aid highway program and the federal
- 6 transportation program; and
- 7 WHEREAS ISTEA gave more flexibility to state and local governments to apply
- 8 innovative solutions to the transportation problems that they face; and
- 9 WHEREAS ISTEA has shifted the focus of the federal surface transportation program
- 10 toward preservation of highway and transit systems, increased efficiency of existing
- 11 transportation networks, and integration of transportation modes to enhance efficiency of the
- 12 transportation system; and
- WHEREAS the states and regional and local governments have invested time and
- 14 energy in making ISTEA work and this investment should not be lost by significantly altering
- 15 the programs initiated by ISTEA; and
- WHEREAS the ISTEA programs can be strengthened by allowing greater flexibility

- 1 between programs and within programs, by allowing greater flexibility to address maintenance 2 needs, by reducing time-consuming federal reviews, mandates, and sanctions, and by allowing 3 self-certification at the state level; and 4 WHEREAS the Federal Highway Administration has adopted a regulation requiring 5 that a major investment study be undertaken by metropolitan planning organizations whenever 6 the need for a major metropolitan transportation investment is identified; and 7 WHEREAS the major investment study requirement overlaps and duplicates planning 8 and project development processes that are already in place under requirements for long-range 9 planning and congestion management systems; and 10 WHEREAS Congress should retain the critical role of the federal government to help 11 fund highway, bridge, ferry, and transit projects and to focus the national transportation policy 12 on mobility, connectivity, integrity, safety, and economic competitiveness; and 13 WHEREAS the State of Alaska receives money under ISTEA for construction and 14 improvement of roads, highways, and the marine highway system and for bridge replacement 15 and rehabilitation, state and metropolitan transportation planning, transit programs, highway 16 safety programs, and enforcement of truck and bus safety requirements; and 17 WHEREAS the state also receives assistance under ISTEA for transportation projects 18 to alleviate air pollution in two areas of the state where air quality does not meet national 19 ambient air quality standards; and 20 WHEREAS 4,300 miles, or about 32 percent of the total mileage, of roads in the state 21 are eligible for federal assistance under ISTEA; and 22 WHEREAS the State of Alaska has relied heavily on federal assistance to support 23 construction and improvement of the surface transportation system in the state; and 24 WHEREAS continued federal assistance is essential to the establishment of the surface 25 transportation system in the state; and 26 WHEREAS the existing surface transportation system in Alaska needs significant 27 repair and maintenance in order to remain a safe and efficient system; and

WHEREAS the State of Alaska cannot maintain or expand the surface transportation

- WHEREAS the funding authorizations for federal assistance and transportation
- 2 programs under ISTEA expired September 30, 1997;
- 3 BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests the
- 4 Congress to reauthorize the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991
- 5 (ISTEA) as soon as possible; and be it
- 6 FURTHER RESOLVED the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests the
- 7 Congress to authorize increased funding for surface transportation projects under ISTEA, if
- **8** possible, but, in any case, to maintain the current levels of funding available under ISTEA;
- 9 and be it
- 10 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests the
- 11 Congress to allow for a portion of the enhancement set aside funds to be used to maintain or
- 12 improve pioneer access trails and historical roadways; and be it
- FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests the
- 14 Congress to allow for a portion of the enhancement set aside funds to be used to maintain
- 15 trails and other facilities that are constructed under that program; and be it
- **FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests the
- 17 Congress to authorize greater use of ISTEA funds for maintenance and repair of existing roads
- 18 and highways; and be it
- 19 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests the
- 20 Congress to eliminate the requirement for major investment studies under 23 C.F.R. 450.318
- 21 as part of the reauthorization of ISTEA; and be it
- **FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests the
- 23 Congress to authorize greater flexibility in the construction of low volume roads suited to
- 24 Alaska's remoteness and sub-Arctic and Arctic environment.
