A RESOLUTION

- 1 Relating to substance abuse treatment for offenders in the criminal justice system.
- 2 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
- 3 WHEREAS substance abuse, specifically the abuse of alcohol and illegal use of
- 4 controlled substances, is a major contributing component in crimes in Alaska and the nation;
- 5 and
- **6 WHEREAS** substance abuse is a significant factor that interferes with the successful
- 7 rehabilitation of persons convicted of crimes; and
- **8** WHEREAS lack of treatment of persons convicted of crimes results in an increased
- 9 rate of recidivism with attending additional crimes and victims; and
- WHEREAS repeat offenders place undue financial burden on the criminal justice
- 11 system of the state;
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature recognizes the social and
- 13 financial benefits that accrue to the state when persons convicted of crimes do not repeat those
- 14 offenses: and be it
- 15 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature recognizes that a consistent
- 16 response to substance abuse by the criminal justice system will result in a decreased rate of
- 17 recidivism; and be it
