A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Congress to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to eliminate
- 2 the marriage penalty by providing that income tax rate bracket amounts, and the
- 3 amount of the standard deduction, for joint returns shall be twice the amounts
- 4 applicable to unmarried individuals.
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
- **6** WHEREAS the federal government is anticipating a budget surplus of \$1.6 trillion
- 7 over the next 10 years; and
- **8** WHEREAS the Congress is considering various options for returning some of that
- 9 surplus to hardworking taxpayers; and
- **10 WHEREAS**, under current law, 21,000,000 married couples pay approximately \$1,400
- 11 more a year in taxes than they would if they were single; and
- WHEREAS the institution of marriage should be supported and not penalized by the
- 13 federal government;
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Alaska State Legislature that the Congress of the United
- 15 States is urged to pass legislation to remove from the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 the
- 16 current discrimination against married individuals in all instances of such discrimination; and

- 3 higher and the standard deduction no lower than that of two single individuals.
