FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- 1 "An Act relating to programs of state reimbursement for debt payments for certain
- 2 capital projects; and providing for an effective date."
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
- * Section 1. The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section
- 5 to read:
- 6 LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS. (a) The port and harbor facilities described in sec. 4 of
- 7 this Act that are currently owned by the state are in need of substantial investment in capital
- 8 maintenance and upgrades.
- 9 (b) The legislature intends to provide for the required investment, and intends transfer
- of ultimate ownership of and responsibility for the state-owned port and harbor facilities to
- 11 the municipalities in which they are located.

1	LEGISLATIVE INTENT. The legislature intends that, after the reinfoursements to
2	the Cordova Electric Cooperative made under AS 42.45.065(b), added by sec. 5(b) of this
3	Act, the cooperative will no longer need or receive payments from the state for power cost
4	equalization under AS 42.45.110.

10	the immediately preceding fiscal year [TWO YEARS EARLIER] for the
