A RESOLUTION

1 Relating to proclaiming April 2001 as Sexual Assault Awareness Month.

2 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS sexual assault is one of the most devastating crimes in society today; and
 WHEREAS Alaska has the highest per capita occurrence of sexual assault in the

5 nation; and

- 6 **WHEREAS** one in four women in America will experience sexual assault at some 7 time in her life; and
- 8 WHEREAS one out of six males will be sexually assaulted by 18 years of age; and
- 9 WHEREAS rape is a significant problem in our prison system; and
- 10 WHEREAS the incidence of rape in Alaska has increased over the past year and is

2.4 times the national average; only one in eight rapes is reported, making rape the mostunderreported of all violent crimes; and

- WHEREAS the division of family and youth services received 1,859 reports of child
 sexual abuse last year alone; and
- WHEREAS child sexual abuse often results in exceptional trauma to the victims and
 in the loss of their childhood innocence; and

WHEREAS these statistics do not include the countless numbers of family members,
 loved ones, coworkers, and neighbors affected by the devastating crime of sexual assault; and

WHEREAS many residents of Alaska work to provide quality services and assistance to sexual assault survivors; dedicated volunteers and professionals respond to emergency calls 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, offering support, comfort, and advocacy throughout all stages of the recovery process, including medical examinations and criminal proceedings; and

7 WHEREAS it is vitally important that residents of Alaska continue to discuss sexual
8 assault and its effects on our families and communities; and

9 WHEREAS it is our goal to improve Alaska's response to sexual assault and to 10 support and enhance educational efforts to provide information about sexual assault and the 11 services available to victim survivors and their loved ones; and

WHEREAS Alaska's Statewide Sexual Violence Prevention Conference, to be held
this September, will benefit from the awareness brought about by Sexual Assault Awareness
Month;

15 **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests the 16 governor to proclaim the month of April 2001 as Sexual Assault Awareness Month; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature urges secondary schools, community organizations, and other public and private agencies and individuals to observe Sexual Assault Awareness Month with suitable activities that increase the public's awareness of the prevalence of sexual assault in Alaska and how it can be combated.
