A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- 1 "An Act relating to organization grants for mergers, consolidations, or unifications
- 2 involving third class boroughs; and relating to identification by the Local Boundary
- 3 Commission of areas that meet the standards for borough incorporation."

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- 5 *** Section 1.** AS 29.05.190(c) is amended to read:
- 6 (c) <u>Except as provided in (d) of this section, this</u> [THIS] section does not 7 apply to a borough incorporated by consolidation or to a unified municipality that 8 occupies the area formerly occupied by a borough.
- 9 * Sec. 2. AS 29.05.190 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
- (d) For the purpose of defraying the cost of government transition, each third
 class borough that merges or consolidates with a city after January 1, 2002, and each
 municipality that unifies after January 1, 2002, in an area formerly occupied by a third
 class borough is entitled to an organization grant of \$200,000 for the municipality's
 first full or partial fiscal year after the merger or consolidation or after unification.

* Sec. 3. The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section to
read:

NEW BOROUGH INCORPORATION. The Local Boundary Commission shall review conditions in the unorganized borough. By the 30th day of the First Regular Session of the Twenty-Third Alaska State Legislature, the commission shall report to the legislature the areas it has identified that meet the standards for incorporation. No portion of the report under this section constitutes a Local Boundary Commission proposal for purposes of art. X, sec. 12, Constitution of the State of Alaska.
