A RESOLUTION

1 Establishing a Senate Special Committee on World Trade and State/Federal Relations.

2 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:**

WHEREAS world trade is of increasing importance to the economy of the state; and
WHEREAS legislation enacted by the federal government has far reaching impact on
the economy of the state; and

6 **WHEREAS** there is renewed interest in the Congress of the United States in 7 exploring the ramifications of federal legislation on the states and their economies; and

8 WHEREAS the legislature should take an active role in exploring opportunities to 9 promote world trade and assist the Congress in understanding the effect of federal legislation 10 on the state's economy;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate that a Senate Special Committee on World Trade and State/Federal Relations is established to study issues relating to world trade and state/federal relations; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the president of the Senate shall determine the number of senators to be members of the committee and shall appoint the members and designate a member to chair the committee; and be it FURTHER RESOLVED that the Senate Special Committee on World Trade and
State/Federal Relations may meet during and between sessions of the Twenty-Second Alaska
State Legislature and is terminated on the convening of the First Session of the Twenty-Third
Alaska State Legislature.
