- * Section 1. AS 05.15.180(g) is amended to read:
 - (g) A municipality or a qualified organization may award a maximum of \$1,000,000 in prizes each year in activities authorized under this chapter; however, if a municipality or a qualified organization contracts with an operator to conduct on its behalf activities authorized under this chapter, the municipality or qualified organization may award a maximum of \$500,000 in prizes each year. A municipality or a qualified organization that conducts a contest of skill and awards more than \$500,000 in prizes to the participants in that contest of skill may exclude \$500,000 in prizes awarded to those participants from the \$1,000,000 maximum allowed in this subsection. The holders of a multiple-beneficiary permit under AS 05.15.100(d) may award a maximum in prizes each year of \$1,000,000 times the number of holders

1	of the permit for activities authorized under this chapter. In this subsection, "activities
