Requesting the Federal Aviation Administration to fully staff and maintain flight service stations in Alaska.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the Alaska flight service stations of the Federal Aviation Administration provide crucial services that are so intimately related to the public interest as to mandate performance by federal employees; and

WHEREAS the Federal Aviation Administration is the agency of the federal government with primary responsibility for the safety of civil aviation in the United States; and

WHEREAS proper staffing and maintenance of the flight service stations is a fundamental necessity for the continuation of crucial services to civil aviation in Alaska; and

WHEREAS the closure or degradation of any flight service stations in Alaska is contrary to the public interest, the primary responsibility of the Federal Aviation Administration for the safety of civil aviation, and homeland defense;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests the Federal Aviation Administration to maintain the current 206 flight service station controllers

in order to properly staff all flight service stations in Alaska and to properly maintain all flight service stations in Alaska.
