* Sec. 59. RETIREMENT SYSTEM FUNDING FOR INCREASED EMPLOYER COSTS FOR POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS. (a) The sum of \$18,426,923 is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Administration to reduce the liability to the public employees' retirement system of political subdivisions that are members of that system, in order to reduce the increased employer costs resulting from fiscal year 2006 employer contribution rate increases.
