Supporting open and free competition within the broadcasting industry.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Alaskans deserve a media venue in which the issues are debated freely and openly; and

WHEREAS, in the past, the Federal Communications Commission regulations have caused the broadcasting industry to avoid important issues relevant to the United States; and

WHEREAS lifting the Fairness Doctrine opened the public airwaves to vigorous, healthy discussion of controversial issues; and

WHEREAS talk radio has emerged as a forum for public debate among people with differing political views across Alaska and the United States; and

WHEREAS the First Amendment right of free speech applies regardless of the medium; and

WHEREAS Americans are entitled to hear all of the facts and arguments on every side of an issue, no matter how controversial;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature supports open and free competition within the broadcasting industry to promote healthy debate on issues between

people with differing backgrounds and from a wide variety of viewpoints; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature opposes federal action that would reverse or inhibit open and free competition within the broadcasting industry.
