AS 38.05.128(a) is amended to read: 5 (a) A person may not obstruct or interfere with the free passage or use by a 6 person of any navigable water unless the obstruction or interference is (1) authorized by <u>law or regulation or by a permit issued by</u> a 7 8 [FEDERAL AGENCY AND A] state agency; 9 (2) [AUTHORIZED UNDER A FEDERAL OR STATE LAW OR 10 PERMIT; 11 (3)] exempt under 33 U.S.C. 1344(f) (Clean Water Act); 12 (3) [(4)] caused by the normal operation of freight barging that is 13 otherwise consistent with law; or

(4) [(5)] authorized by the commissioner after reasonable public
notice.

(14) "navigable water" means any water of the state forming a river,
stream, lake, pond, slough, creek, bay, sound, estuary, inlet, strait, passage, canal, sea
or ocean, or any other body of water or waterway within the territorial limits of the
state or subject to its jurisdiction [,] that is navigable in fact in any season, whether in

8 <u>a frozen or liquid state, and</u> for any useful public purpose, including [BUT NOT 9 LIMITED TO] water suitable for commercial navigation, floating of logs, landing and 10 takeoff of aircraft, and public boating, trapping, hunting waterfowl and aquatic 11 animals, fishing, or other public recreational purposes;
