Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Therriault at 10:12 a.m.

The roll showed nineteen members present. The seat from District R was vacant.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Senator Olson. Senator Hoffman moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Our Heavenly Father, this morning as we gather together to make decisions that are to be made, Lord, we pray for wisdom along that decision-making process.
