Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Therriault at 11:14 a.m.

The roll showed seventeen members present. Senators Davis, Ogan were excused from a call of the Senate. Senator Wagoner was absent.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Pastor Sam Dalin of the River of Glory Church. Senator Hoffman moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Father, we would ask that for the Leman household and that extended family, Your grace and Your peace would be upon the whole situation right now with the passing of our Lt. Governor's father-in-law.
