Seventieth Day

Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Therriault at 10:51 a.m.

The roll showed eighteen members present. Senators Dyson, Olson were excused from a call of the Senate.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Senator Taylor. Senator Hoffman moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Senator Seekins led the Senate in the Pledge of Allegiance.
