## **Eighty-fifth Day**

Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Therriault at 11:13 a.m.

The roll showed eighteen members present. Senators Guess, Lincoln were excused from a call of the Senate.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Father Thomas Weise of St. Paul's Catholic Church. Senator Hoffman moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.
