TASK FORCE ON ALASKA COASTAL ZONE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM. (a) There is established in the legislative branch of state government the Task Force on Alaska Coastal Zone Management Program. Members of the task force shall be appointed to represent the state as a whole and not just a particular region or industry sector. The president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives shall jointly appoint the chair and vice-chair of the task force. The task force shall consist of 11 voting members as follows:

(1) two members of the senate appointed jointly by the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives;

(2) two members from the house of representatives appointed jointly by the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives;

(3) the following seven public members who are jointly appointed by the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives, in consultation with the governor:

(A) three individuals representing Alaska coastal resource districts;

(B) three individuals representing Alaska resource development industries;

(C) one individual representing the public at large.

(b) The members of the task force appointed under (a)(3) of this section are not eligible for compensation but are entitled to per diem and travel expenses authorized for boards and commissions under AS 39.20.180.

(c) The Task Force on Alaska Coastal Zone Management Program shall

(1) review the changes and modifications contained in secs. 1 - 44, 46, 47, and 50 of this Act, and other aspects of the Alaska coastal management program, and make recommendations on any modifications needed to carry out the findings of the legislature in sec. 1 of this Act;

(2) assist the Department of Natural Resources to develop guidelines and regulations to carry out the provisions of secs. 1 - 44, 46, 47, and 50 of this Act and the adjustments, if any, recommended by the task force under (1) of this subsection;

(3) deliver a report to the legislature by the 10th day after the convening of the Second Regular Session of the Twenty-Third Alaska State Legislature."

(2) **50 percent of all mineral lease rentals, royalties, royalty sale proceeds, net profit shares under AS 38.05.180(f) and (g), and federal mineral revenue sharing payments received by the state from mineral leases issued after December 1, 1979, and 50 percent of all bonuses received by the state from mineral leases issued after February 15, 1980; and**

(3) any other money appropriated to or otherwise allocated by law or former law to the Alaska permanent fund.

* **Sec. 5.** The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section to read:

CONDITIONAL EFFECT OF SECTIONS 2 AND 4. (a) Before October 1 of each year, the commissioner of revenue shall calculate the amount by which each permanent fund dividend is

reduced as a result of the amendment to AS 37.13.010(a) in sec. 3 of this Act when compared to what the amount of each dividend would have been for that year had the amendment to AS 37.13.010(a) in sec. 3 of this Act not taken effect. If the amount of that reduction is equal to or greater than \$20, secs. 2 and 4 of this Act take effect.

(b) The calculation under this section shall take into account the change in deposits to the Alaska permanent fund that resulted from the amendment to AS 37.13.010(a) in sec. 3 of this Act for the period beginning on the effective date of that amendment through June 30 of the year the calculation is being made.

* **Sec. 6.** Sections 1, 3, and 5 of this Act take effect immediately under AS 01.10.070(c).

* **Sec. 7.** If secs. 2 and 4 of this Act take effect under sec. 5 of this Act, they take effect on October 1 of the year in which the commissioner of revenue determines that, as a result of the amendment to AS 37.13.010(a) in sec. 3 of this Act, the value of the permanent fund dividend for that year has been reduced by at least \$20. The commissioner of revenue shall promptly notify the revisor of statutes of the date secs. 2 and 4 of this Act take effect."
