- (2) <u>\$5,000,000 or more</u> [BETWEEN \$5,000,000 AND \$10,000,000, INCLUSIVE,] must be designed to adequately serve planned future traffic for at least the next 20 years [AFTER CONSTRUCTION OF THE PROJECT:
- (3) MORE THAN \$10,000,000 MUST BE DESIGNED TO ADEQUATELY SERVE PLANNED FUTURE TRAFFIC FOR AT LEAST THE NEXT 25 YEARS AFTER CONSTRUCTION OF THE PROJECT]."
