# Eighty-eighth Day

### SB 308

Forthcoming Judiciary Committee Substitute (page 2818) for SENATE BILL NO. 308 "An Act increasing the duration of certain provisions of domestic violence protective orders from six months to one year" was received today:

CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 308(JUD) "An Act relating to warnings on domestic violence and stalking forms; and increasing the duration of certain provisions of domestic violence protective orders from six months to up to one year."

Forthcoming Letter of Intent (page 2818) for the Judiciary Committee Substitute for SENATE BILL NO. 308 was received today:

# Letter of Intent

The purpose of Sections 1 and 3 of this Act is to require the Alaska Court System to include conspicuous warning language about penalty of

perjury on forms for petitions and protective orders, as well as instructions for their use by a person seeking a protective order under AS 18.65.850 – 18.65.860.

"It is the intent of the Senate Judiciary Committee that this requirement applies only to new material printed after the effective date of this Act. The Alaska Court System may continue to supply written material printed before the effective date of this Act until those materials are exhausted."

#### **SB 318**

The Resources Committee considered SENATE BILL NO. 318 "An Act relating to the individual right of Alaska residents in the consumptive use of fish and game" and recommended it be replaced with

CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 318(RES) "An Act relating to a preference for Alaska residents in the consumptive uses of fish and game."
