Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Harris at 10:10 a.m.

Roll call showed 32 members present. Representative Thomas had been previously excused from a call of the House today. Representatives Chenault, Holm, Meyer, and Ramras were absent and their presence was noted later. Representative Weyhrauch was absent.

Representative Coghill moved and asked unanimous consent that Representatives Croft and Kapsner be excused from a call of the House today. There being no objection, it was so ordered.
