First Day

The roll showed eighteen members present. Senator Guess was excused from a call of the Senate. Senator Kookesh was absent.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Senator Wagoner. Senator Hoffman moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

The purpose of the Joint Session was to hear an address by the Honorable Frank H. Murkowski, Governor.

Senator Gary Stevens moved and asked unanimous consent that the roll call of the Senate be waived and all members be shown as present. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Representative Coghill moved and asked unanimous consent that the roll call of the House be waived and all members be shown as present. Without objection, it was so ordered.

President Stevens appointed Representative Meyer and Senator Gary Stevens to escort the Governor to the Joint Session.

The Senate Sergeant at Arms, Gary Stambaugh, announced the Governor's entrance into the House Chamber.

The Honorable Frank H. Murkowski was escorted to the rostrum.

Governor Murkowski delivered his address and it is published in Senate and House Joint Journal Supplement No. 16.

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Governor Murkowski received a standing ovation and was escorted from the Chamber by Senator Gary Stevens and Representative Meyer.

Senator Gary Stevens moved and asked unanimous consent that the joint session stand in adjournment. Without objection, President Stevens adjourned the joint session at 11:46 a.m.
