Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House concurred in the Senate amendments to HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 9 am Urging the United States Congress to honor the process and judgment of the federal courts in the case of the Exxon Valdez disaster and to refrain from enacting legislation that would affect the outcome of the courts' resolution of the case, thus adopting:

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 13(FIN) "An Act relating to reimbursement of municipal bonds for school construction; increasing the base student allocation used in the formula for state financing of public education; relating to the district cost factors for state funding of public education; relating to school improvement funding; and providing for an effective date."

HB 16

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House concurred in the Senate amendment to CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 16(RLS) "An Act relating to funding for school districts operating secondary school boarding programs, to funding for school districts from which boarding students come, and to the effectiveness of district secondary school boarding programs; and providing for an effective date" thus adopting:

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 16(FIN) "An Act relating to funding for school districts operating statewide residential educational programs; and providing for an effective date."

HB 41

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House concurred in the Senate amendment to CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 41(FIN) "An Act relating to minimum periods of imprisonment for the crime of assault in the fourth degree committed against an employee of an elementary, junior high, or secondary school or certain contractors of school districts who were engaged in the performance of school duties at the time of the assault" thus adopting:

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 41(JUD) "An Act relating to minimum periods of imprisonment for the crime of assault in the fourth degree committed on school grounds, on a school bus, at a school-sponsored event, or at certain school district administration offices."

HB 83

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House concurred in the Senate amendment to CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 83(FIN), thus adopting:

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 83(FIN) "An Act relating to the Alaska Seismic Hazards Safety Commission; and providing for an effective date."

HB 105

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House concurred in the Senate amendment to CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 105(FIN), thus adopting:

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 105(FIN) "An Act relating to coverage for adult dental services under Medicaid; and providing for an effective date."

HB 107

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House failed to concur in the Senate amendment to CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 107(FIN), namely:

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 107(JUD) "An Act relating to unlawful obstruction or hindrance of hunting, fishing, trapping, or viewing of fish or game; and amending Rule 82, Alaska Rules of Civil Procedure, and Rule 508, Alaska Rules of Appellate Procedure."

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HB 109

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House concurred in the Senate amendment to CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 109(FIN), thus adopting:

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 109(FIN) "An Act relating to establishing a screening, tracking, and intervention program related to the hearing ability of newborns and infants; providing an exemption to licensure as an audiologist for certain persons performing hearing screening; relating to insurance coverage for newborn and infant hearing screening; and providing for an effective date."

HB 240

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House concurred in the Senate amendment to CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 240(RLS) am, thus adopting:

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 240(FIN) "An Act relating to brewery and brewpub licensing and relating to sales of wine by a winery licensee."

HB 258

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House concurred in the Senate amendment to CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 258(JUD) "An Act relating to aggravating factors at sentencing for sexual assault and sexual abuse" thus adopting:

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 258(JUD) "An Act relating to sexual abuse of a minor in the second degree and to aggravating factors at sentencing for sexual assault and sexual abuse."

HB 326

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House concurred in the Senate amendment to CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 326(JUD) am "An Act relating to the definition of the crime of harassment" thus adopting:

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 326(JUD) "An Act relating to the definition of the crime of harassment; and providing for an effective date."

HB 334

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House concurred in the Senate amendment to CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 334(FIN) "An Act relating to an exemption from and deferral of municipal property taxes for certain types of deteriorated property" thus adopting:

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 334(FIN) "An Act relating to a mandatory exemption for certain residences owned by a religious organization, to an exemption from and deferral of municipal property taxes for certain types of deteriorated property, and to an optional deferral of municipal property taxes on certain primary residences owned and occupied by individuals with incomes at or below federal poverty guidelines for the state."

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House has adopted the report of the Conference Committee with limited powers of free conference considering SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 365(FIN)(brf sup maj fld S) and CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 365(FIN) am(brf sup maj fld), thus adopting:

CONFERENCE CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 365 "An Act making appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of state government, for certain programs, and to capitalize funds; making appropriations for state aid to public schools, centralized correspondence study, and transportation of pupils; and providing for an effective date."

Pursuant to a Legislative Finance Division memorandum regarding a technical error in section 3, the following is engrossed and enrolled:

CONFERENCE CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 365(Corrected) "An Act making appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of state government, for certain programs, and to capitalize funds; making appropriations for state aid to public schools, centralized correspondence study, and transportation of pupils; and providing for an effective date."

The Senate adopted CONFERENCE CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 365 on May 9 (page 3376).

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House concurred in the Senate amendments to CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 381(FIN), thus adopting:

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 381(FIN) am S "An Act relating to the financing of construction, major maintenance, and renovation of certain capital projects; authorizing the commissioner of revenue to sell the right to receive a portion of the anticipated revenue from a tobacco litigation settlement to the Northern Tobacco Securitization Corporation, and relating to that sale and the use of the revenue; authorizing the Northern Tobacco Securitization Corporation to issue bonds and use the proceeds to acquire the right to receive a portion of anticipated revenue from a tobacco litigation settlement and for other purposes, and relating to those bonds; and providing for an effective date."

HB 399

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House concurred in the Senate amendment to CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 399(FIN), thus adopting:

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 399(STA) "An Act establishing the office of elder fraud and assistance; and relating to fraud involving older Alaskans."

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House concurred in the Senate amendment to CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 403(FIN), thus adopting:

SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 403(TRA) "An Act relating to registration and operation of low-speed vehicles."

Message dated May 9 was received, stating the House has adopted the corrected report of the Conference Committee with limited powers of free conference considering SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 414(JUD) and CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 414(RLS) am, thus adopting:

CONFERENCE CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 414(Corrected) "An Act relating to the interception of the private communications of a minor."
