Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Harris at 11:04 a.m.

Roll call showed 38 members present. Representatives Foster and Ramras were excused.

Representative Samuels moved and asked unanimous consent that Representative Guttenberg be excused from a call of the House from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., today. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

The invocation was offered by the Chaplain, the Reverend Michael Spainhoward of St. Nicholas Russian Orthodox Church. Representative LeDoux moved and asked unanimous consent that the invocation be spread on the journal. There being no objection, it was so ordered.
