Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President pro tempore Stevens at 10:05 a.m.

The roll showed eighteen members present. Senator Green was excused from a call of the Senate. Senator McGuire was absent.

Senator Huggins, Acting Majority Leader, moved and asked unanimous consent that Senator Green be excused from a call of the Senate from today through morning plane time, March 5. Without objection, Senator Green was excused.

Senator Huggins, Acting Majority Leader, moved and asked unanimous consent that Senator McGuire be excused from a call of the Senate today. Without objection, Senator McGuire was excused.

"APPLICABILITY. Sections 4, 5, and 7 of this Act apply to a person who leaves state service on or after the effective date of secs. 4 and 5 of this Act."
