First Day

Pursuant to the Governor's proclamation dated April 17, 2011, calling the legislature into special session, the House was called to order by Speaker Chenault at 1:09 p.m.

Roll call showed 39 members present. Representative Doogan was absent and his presence was noted later.

The invocation was offered by the Chaplain, Representative T. Wilson. Representative P. Wilson moved and asked unanimous consent that the invocation be spread on the journal. There being no objection, it was so ordered.
