Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Stevens at 1:32 p.m.

The roll showed seventeen members present. Senators Coghill, Dyson, Stedman were absent.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Helena Fagan, Director of the Juneau Shambhala Meditation Center. Senator Hoffman moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

The Shambhala teachings are founded on the premise that there is basic human wisdom that can help solve the world's problems. Trungpa Rinpoche, who brought these teachings to the West, taught that this wisdom does not belong to any one culture or religion, nor does it come only from the West or the East. May all beings enjoy happiness and the root of happiness. May they be free from suffering and the root of suffering. May they dwell in equanimity free from passion, aggression, and prejudice.
