Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Chenault at 10:42 a.m.

Roll call showed 32 members present. Representatives Costello, Feige, Guttenberg, Hughes, LeDoux, Nageak, and Saddler had been previously excused from a call of the House today. Representative Herron was absent.
