Opposing any international designation of Alaska land or water as an international park, world heritage site, biosphere reserve, Ramsar site, or other classification of land or water that affects the use of land or water by the state or an Alaska Native corporation without approval by the United States Congress and the Alaska State Legislature; requesting the United States Department of State and the United States Department of the Interior to cease all further action related to an international designation for land and water in the state until the action is approved by the United States Congress and the Alaska State Legislature; requesting that the United States Congress pass legislation requiring Congressional approval of any international designation that affects the use of land or water by the state or the United States; requesting that the governor be involved in the process and development of any joint action plan; requesting that the state, including the departments responsible for the management of fish and wildlife and other natural resources, be an integral part of any discussion, agreement, understanding, or other process that affects the use or development of fish and wildlife and other natural resources in the state; and urging the governor and the attorney general to reserve all legal remedies for a taking of the natural resources of the state by an international designation of land and water in the state

Governor's transmittal letter dated January 17:

Dear President Huggins,

Under the authority of Article III, Section 18 of the Alaska Constitution, I am transmitting a bill relating to the State's operating budget for Fiscal Year 2015 (FY 2015).

Leaving a strong, vibrant Alaska for our children and grandchildren requires living within our means and prioritizing spending for Alaskans' future. My operating budget for FY 2015 proposes to pay down State debt and significantly reduce State government spending. Even at this reduced level, the budget represents my continued commitment to Alaska's constitutional priorities including resource development, public safety, education, transportation, and infrastructure.

The operating budget also proposes a solution to address Alaska's single largest cost driver – unfunded pension liabilities. I am recommending a transfer of \$3 billion from the Constitutional Budget Reserve fund into the State's retirement trust funds. The effect is to pay down debt, resulting in lower fixed annual payments for the State. Your approval of this plan will significantly reduce our annual operating costs instead of pushing it off to future generations.

With a responsible budget plan, and the increased jobs and economic activity being generated by the More Alaska Production Act, our state will continue to be prosperous and full of opportunity. I look forward to working with the Legislature to finalize the operating budget for the upcoming fiscal year.
