Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Edgmon at 10:33 a.m.

Roll call showed 39 members present. Representative Westlake had been excused from a call of the House today.

The invocation was offered by the Chaplain, the Reverend Dr. Douglas Dye of Chapel by the Lake Presbyterian Church. Representative Wilson moved and asked unanimous consent that the invocation be spread on the journal. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

President Kelly appointed Representative Drummond and Senator Hughes to escort the Senator to the joint session.

The Senate Sergeant-at-Arms announced the Senator's entrance into the House Chamber.

Senator Murkowski was escorted to the rostrum and welcomed by President Kelly.

Senator Murkowski delivered her address, and it is published in House and Senate Joint Journal Supplement No. 5.

A question and answer period followed the conclusion of the Senator's speech.

Senator Murkowski received a standing ovation.

Senator Micciche moved and asked unanimous consent that the joint session adjourn. There being no objection, President Kelly adjourned the joint session at 11:48 a.m.

The Speaker ordered the House at ease to allow members of the Senate to leave the Chamber.
