First Day

Pursuant to provisions of the Constitution of the State of Alaska, the Uniform Rules of the Alaska State Legislature, and AS 24.05.160, the Senate of the State of Alaska assembled in the Senate chamber for the first regular session of the Thirtieth Legislature. The Senate was called to order at 2:04 p.m. by the Honorable Byron Mallott, Lieutenant Governor.
