# **One Hundred Fourteenth Day**

Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Kelly at 11:35 a.m.

The roll showed twenty members present.

Senator Micciche moved and asked unanimous consent to take up the recede message on SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 57(FIN) am S "An Act making appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of state government and for certain programs; capitalizing funds; repealing appropriations; making supplemental appropriations and reappropriations; making appropriations under art. IX, sec. 17(c), Constitution of the State of Alaska, from the constitutional budget reserve fund; and providing for an effective date" which had been held on the Secretary's desk (page 905). Without objection, it was so ordered.

### **Second Reading of Senate Bills**

### **SB 23**

SENATE BILL NO. 23 "An Act making appropriations, including capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, reappropriations, and other appropriations; making appropriations to capitalize funds; and providing for an effective date" was read the second time.

Senator MacKinnon, Cochair, moved and asked unanimous consent for the adoption of the Finance Committee Substitute offered on page 1145. Senator Gardner objected, then withdrew her objection. There being no further objection, CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 23(FIN) "An Act making appropriations, including capital

appropriations, supplemental appropriations, reappropriations, and other appropriations; amending appropriations; making appropriations to capitalize funds; and providing for an effective date" was adopted.

President Kelly stated CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 23(FIN) will advance to third reading on the May 11 calendar.
