Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Kelly at 11:08 a.m.

The roll showed eighteen members present. Senator Meyer was excused from a call of the Senate. The seat from District E was vacant.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Pastor Dan Wiese, Church of the Nazarene. Senator Hoffman moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

HJR 19

Message dated February 12 was read stating the Speaker respectfully requests the following be returned:

CS FOR HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 19(AET) Commending the Arctic Waterways Safety Committee; supporting the adoption of prevention measures into international agreements to ensure clear, universal, and enforceable marine safety measures in the Arctic; urging the state's delegation in the United States Congress and the governor to promote the adoption of spill prevention measures into international agreements; and urging the President of the United States and the United States Department of State to initiate negotiations to enter into international agreements to ensure safe and environmentally responsible marine operations in the Arctic.
