Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Kelly at 11:09 a.m.

Almighty G-d, I invoke your blessing today on this honorable body, the Alaska State Senate. Especially in these troubling times, when we are all watching again and again the very tragic mass murder committed in our public schools, by confused and misguided students.

Almighty G-d, please invoke your blessings upon the Alaska State Senate, who are following the American tradition of four decades, established by U.S. Congress and presidents, to mark the birthday of the great spiritual leader, the Rebbe, Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneerson, on March 27th, 2018, as Education and Sharing Day U.S.A. here in the great state of Alaska.
