Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Kelly at 11:06 a.m.

The roll showed nineteen members present. Senator Egan was absent.

Senator Micciche moved and asked unanimous consent Senator Egan be excused from a call of the Senate today. Without objection, Senator Egan was excused.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Pastor Mike Rydman, Radiant Church Juneau. Senator Hoffman moved and asked unanimous consent that the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Oh Lord God, in 1 Chronicles 29 it says that:

King David blessed the LORD in the presence of all the assembly. And David said: "Blessed are you, O LORD, the God of Israel our father, forever and ever. Draw us all closer to you in these days, O Lord. Be God in our midst. For Yours is the Kingdom and the power and the glory forever.
