SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 2001(FIN) am S "An Act making appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of state government and for certain programs; capitalizing funds; making supplemental appropriations, reappropriations, and other appropriations; making appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program; and providing for an effective date" which passed the Senate July 29 (page 1421) with engrossment waived, was engrossed and returned to the House on July 30.

Renumber the following paragraphs accordingly.

The appropriation made in sec. 16(a)(16) of this Act, page 21, lines 8 - 12, is a duplicate reappropriation of the appropriation made in sec. 13 of this Act. Due to a drafting error, the appropriation was not removed when sec. 13 was added to the bill. We have removed sec. 16(a)(16), consistent with legislative intent. The estimated total of the appropriations made in sec. 16(a) has been adjusted accordingly.
