HB 110

HOUSE BILL NO. 110 by Representative Hannan, entitled:

"An Act raising the minimum age to purchase, sell, exchange, or possess tobacco, a product containing nicotine, or an electronic smoking product; relating to transporting tobacco, a product containing nicotine, or an electronic smoking product; relating to the taxation of electronic smoking products; and providing for an effective date."

was read the first time and referred to the Community & Regional Affairs and Judiciary Committees.

HB 111

HOUSE BILL NO. 111 by Representatives Spohnholz and Kreiss-Tomkins, entitled:

"An Act relating to the practice of dental hygiene; relating to advanced practice permits for dental hygienists; relating to dental assistants; prohibiting unfair discrimination under group health insurance against a dental hygienist who holds an advanced practice permit; relating to medical assistance for dental hygiene services; and providing for an effective date."

was read the first time and referred to the Labor & Commerce and Finance Committees.

HB 112

HOUSE BILL NO. 112 by Representative Spohnholz, entitled:

"An Act relating to the transfer of a title to a boat on the death of the owner; relating to the transfer of a title to a vehicle, including certain manufactured homes and trailers, on the death of the owner; allowing a person to act for the surviving spouse of a decedent to enforce liability against real property transferred at death; relating to changes of address; and providing for an effective date."

The Governor's transmittal letter dated February 23 follows:

"Dear Speaker Stutes:

Under the authority of Article III, Section 18 of the Alaska Constitution, I am transmitting a bill to establish an All-Payer Claims Database (APCD) for Alaska. An APCD is a state maintained database that provides for the systematic collection of health care payment data from insurers and providers to assist policymakers and industry professionals to analyze costs, quality, and utilization for improved decision-making and policy formulation.

The Alaska Healthcare Transformation Project (AHTP) identified the establishment of an APCD as a critical first step in helping understand health spending trends, utilization, and pricing variation in Alaska in order to provide better transparency, inform policy and address health care costs.

This bill makes changes to the Alaska Insurance Code to authorize the division of insurance to establish a statewide APCD to collect, aggregate, and report on claims data and to allow the division director to select a lead organization to coordinate and manage the database. Under this proposal, certain insurers and providers will be required to

submit their health cost data. This data will be aggregated for policy analysis, cost trends and to potentially help inform consumers about their health care choices.

I urge your prompt and favorable action on this important reform measure.

HB 114

HOUSE BILL NO. 114 by the House Rules Committee by request of the Governor, entitled:

"An Act relating to the education loan program and Alaska supplemental education loan program; and providing for an effective date."

was read the first time and referred to the Education Committee.

The Governor's transmittal letter dated February 23 follows:

"Dear Speaker Stutes:

Under the authority of Article III, Section 18, of the Alaska Constitution, I am transmitting a bill relating to the education loan program for postsecondary students.

The bill would increase opportunities for borrowers to consolidate education loans by expanding options to show eligibility. Current statute requires that borrowers physically reside in the State. This bill adds additional eligibility options to include being a previous borrower, cosigner, or beneficiary of an education loan made under

AS 14.43 or AS 14.44, or being a graduate of a high school or postsecondary institution physically located in the State.

Specific loan limits would be removed from statute and instead the Alaska Student Loan Corporation would have the authority to set limits, as appropriate, to address evolving student needs. The bill would also clarify that a borrower's obligation to commence repayment of the loan could begin immediately upon disbursement of the loan.

This legislation will increase responsiveness to Alaska's higher education community and will allow for responsible increases to annual loan limits and originations to meet the financial aid needs of Alaska's student loan borrowers.
