Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Stevens at 10:31 a.m.

The roll showed eighteen members present. Senator Myers was excused from a call of the Senate. Senator Gray-Jackson was absent.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Daymond Geary, Pastor of Breakthrough Church. Senator Hoffman moved and asked unanimous consent the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.
