First Day

Pursuant to the May 17 Proclamation of the Governor calling for convening of the First Special Session of the Thirty-Third Alaska Legislature, the Senate was called to order by President Stevens at 12:06 p.m.

The roll showed sixteen members present. Senators Hoffman, Kawasaki, Olson were excused from a call of the Senate. Senator Shower was absent.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Senator Bjorkman. Senator Wielechowski moved and asked unanimous consent the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.
