

HB 293 – By Rep. Fields

AM #	Sponsor	Description
1 (A.1)	Rep Fields	Clarifies that genetic counseling advisory council members are not entitled to travel / per diem reimbursement.
2 (A.2)	Rep Carrick	Deletes the genetic counseling advisory council from the bill.
3 (A.3)	Rep Fields	Cleans up transition section to say that certified genetic counselors may be appointed to the advisory council before they have attained their personal licensure, and they may continue to serve out their term if they obtain their license by July 1, 2027.
4 (A.4)	Rep Coulombe	Allows for the extension of a temporary license with the support of a supervising genetic counselor or physician.
5 (A.5)	Rep. Coulombe	Modifies the scope of practice for genetic counselors by deleting language around providing resources for medical, educational, financial, and psychosocial support.
6 (A.6)	Rep. Coulombe	Deletes the genetic counseling advisory council from the bill (Duplicate to A.2)
7 (A.7)	Rep. Coulombe	The bill provides for a genetic counselor who does not satisfy the requirements for licensure, but who has served in the field for 10+ years, to qualify for licensure using three letters of recommendation. The amendment deletes this provision.
8 (A.8)	Rep. Saddler	Removes the genetic counseling intern from the bill.
