- 1. Create an Alaska Department of Agriculture
- 2. Expand leases on state-owned land and ensure agriculture activities via a state-driven proactive approach.
- 3. Increase research capacity and programs through UAF IANRE's agricultural and forestry experiment stations.
- 4. Improve access to capital for producers through the Agricultural Revolving Loan Fund (ARLF) and the HB 298 Agricultural Forgivable Loan Programs (AFLP).
- 5. Encourage tax exemptions for farmland.
- 6. Create Alaska Grown Marketing Institute.
- 7. Re-establish an Alaska meat inspection service.
- 8. Add technical assistance officer position.
- 9. Request grocery stores track and sell more Alaska Grown.
- 10. Expand Agricultural Revolving Loan Fund to food processors and manufacturers.
- 11. Improve maritime infrastructure.
- 12. Decrease rural hub food loss via climate-controlled storage infrastructure.
- *13. Improve aviation infrastructure.*
- 14. Improve bypass mail operations.
- 15. Improve data collection and analysis.
- 16. Invest in research and innovative technologies.
- 17. Create Supply Chain Coordination Council.
- 18. Increase food storage capacity for community food banks and disaster preparedness.
- 19. Extend Northern Rail
- 20. Establish a competitive shipping marketplace in Alaska.
- 21. Develop educational programs for food manufacturing in Alaska.
- 22. Establish a state food security and manufacturing officer in Alaska.
- 23. Invest in financial scoping of community-level composting and scale-appropriate rural biogas production facilities.
- 24. Support rural hub and transportation infrastructure.
- 25. Improve connecting food donors with food recovery and distribution entities.
- 26. Leverage Alaska match with GusNIP.
- 27. Coordinate with federal delegation to advocate for USPS improvements to bypass mail.
- ► (28) Establish co-op purchasing for school foods.
  - 29. Address the SNAP/FDPIR enrollment conflict.
  - 30. Streamline and make food security data transparent.
  - 31. Improve aviation infrastructure.
