Analysis

This bill adds civics education and assessment to the list of secondary school graduation requirements. The State Board of Education must develop and maintain: 1) a statewide civic education and comparative government curriculum, 2) a 100 question civic assessment based on the civics portion of the naturalization examination used by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services of the Department of Homeland Security, 3) a civics project-based assessment, 4) regulations to identify students who have attained a high level of proficiency in civic knowledge, civic skills, a civic mindset, and civic experiences, 5) a seal of civic readiness that may be attached to a student's school transcript and diploma. Students must receive a passing score of 70 percent or more on one of the assessments in order to receive a secondary school diploma.
The fiscal note is indeterminate due to the department needing more time to determine the costs associated with the various provisions in the legislation.

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
