BILL NO. SB 235

Analysis

This bill concerns municipal authority over automated traffic safety cameras. It would amend Alaska Statute 29.10.200 by adding a new section to Alaska Statute 29.35 reserving to the state the authority to regulate automated traffic safety cameras and prohibiting municipalities from banning their use unless expressly authorized by statute. The bill also provides a definition for “automated traffic safety camera.”

The bill does not identify a state agency responsible for regulating automated traffic safety cameras, does not require the adoption of regulations, and does not establish a statewide program for the deployment or operation of such devices. No duties, responsibilities, or implementation requirements are assigned to the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF).

As currently drafted, the DOT&PF does not anticipate direct costs associated with this bill. Installation of any hardware within Department rights-of-way would, however, require a permit from the Department. There is also potential for incremental increases in utility expenses for devices collocated on roadside infrastructure when power sources are shared. Additionally, the Department may incur modest increases in maintenance costs if collocated roadside equipment is damaged by errant vehicles.
